



How to identify your video tapes



Please use this document to identify your video tapes, to ensure we are able to convert them for you. If you're still not sure which tape you have, you may like to measure it with a ruler or tape-measure to see if it matches any of these sizes...

Tape type VHS or Super VHS (aka S-VHS)
Dimensions Approximately 19cm (L), 10.5cm (W), 2.5cm (H)
Can we convert? Yes, we can convert this type of video tape



Tape type VHS-C (aka Compact VHS)
Dimensions Approximately 9cm (L), 6cm (W), 2cm (H)
Can we convert? Yes, we can convert this type of video tape



VHS-C tapes are often placed inside a special adaptor, so that normal VHS players can play them

Tape type MiniDV
Dimensions Approximately 6.5cm (L), 5cm (W), 1cm (H)
Can we convert? Yes, we can convert this type of video tape



A VHS tape compared to MiniDV tapes

MiniDV tapes can be recorded in either SD (standard definition) or HD (high definition) modes. At this stage, we can only record standard definition MiniDV tapes.

Tape type Hi8 / Digital8 / Video 8 / 8mm
Dimensions Approximately 9.5cm (L), 6.5cm (W), 1.5cm (H) ...similar in size to a music cassette
Can we convert? Yes, we can convert this type of video tape
